

DESIGNS

Secondary processes including hand painting and material inlay can give a design an added dimension, making it a real focal point.







CASE STUDY

LONG ITCHINGTON WAR MEMORIAL

The village of Long Itchington, Warwickshire lost 4% of its male population during the First World War but did not have a permanent and visible memorial.

The community raised funds to develop a memorial consisting of three large monoliths, manufactured from Marshalls Scoutmoor Natural Stone.

The names of the 54 men who lost their lives, and a poem 'The Falling Leaves' were sandblasted into the stone, and finished with paint to provide a contrast. In addition 54 corresponding bronze leaves were inlaid across the stone.

This elegant monument pays a fitting tribute to the village's fallen soldiers and means their sacrifice will be remembered for years to come.

CASE STUDY

NATIONAL MEMORIAL ARBORETUM

As part of a new £15.7 million development of a remembrance centre at the National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas, Staffordshire, Marshalls was approached to supply a traditional looking hard landscaping solution.

A £12 million appeal was launched in 2009 by HRH the Duke of Cambridge, the Patron, to rebuild the visitor centre so that those visiting the Arboretum would be able to enjoy outstanding facilities.

In the middle of this stunning new development, a courtyard called Heroes' Square was proposed. The square is home to over 300 stone flags that have been intricately sandblasted with cap badges or crests of the Royal Navy, the British Army, the Royal Air Force and City Livery Companies.

The individual Scoutmoor Yorkstone flags were sandblasted over an agreed period of time in order to meet the client's scheduling plan.

Scoutmoor Yorkstone is exceptionally hardwearing and has beautiful natural colour variation. The blue grey and brown hues of the stone integrated well with the surrounding landscape, and perfectly coordinated with the larch timber used in the building's structure.

CASE STUDY

WELLINGTON PLACE

As part of the development of new offices in Leeds Wellington Place, Marshalls were selected to supply a range of Natural Stone paving products from the Granite Collection.

A three colour mix consisting of silver grey, mid grey and a buff was selected and applied in a random laying pattern. The stone was laid in plank format to give the appearance of a more expansive space.

The buff granite brings with it a suitable contrast to the grey tones to offer a welcomed accent in the mix and coordinate with the timber used in the granite seating. Together with the plank format paving, Marshalls also supplied bespoke granite seating and planter units with timber cladding to house the area's soft landscaping. The planters were supplied in the same material as the silver grey used in the granite paving mix for a cohesive aesthetic.

Marshalls' granite was also selected for the step units leading to the entranceways to the building, complete with contrasting treads for enhanced visibility.

Marshalls were also invited to provide the Granite for the bespoke natural stone water feature for the second stage of the building works at this development.



CASE STUDY MONUMENT STREET

When London's Monument Street underwent redevelopment, it was important that the area did not lose its identity and history.

To commemorate the Great Fire of London, which began on the street over 350 years ago and had a significant impact on the City of London, Marshalls were asked to create a bespoke seating area consisting of eight Prospero Granite benches.

The solid granite benches had the lettering from the children's nursery rhyme London's Burning sandblasted into the face before being finished with hand painted detail and practical anti-skateboarding deterrents.

CASE STUDY GOLDMAN SACHS


Gross Max and the City of London wanted to embrace and incorporate the history of the surrounding area into the design of this unique outside space.

Nestled off Shoe Lane and Stonecutter Street in the heart of the City sits 'Goldman Sachs' new London head office.

Bold, natural and artistic aesthetics were a key driver for this landscape which incorporates a number of bespoke solutions to protect, dress and compliment the building. Natural stone masonry was used to deliver an integrated security solution that sits alongside a series of stunning and unique interlocking planters that were meticulously designed for Stonecutter Street.

Anti-skate detail and an etched and hand painted street name were added to the flamed Calisto granite planters lining Shoe Lane and Farringdon street, all of which complimenting the Scoutmoor used to pave the area.

Hand masonry, skilled engraving, 3D Printing and excellent craftsmanship help deliver a design led, functional scheme which pays homage to the local history and surrounding streets.







FORM & FINISH

ITS ALL IN THE FINISH

Applying a texture to stone can dramatically affect its appearance, from the subtle change in how light is refracted to the complete change in colour.

Mixing texturing methods such as flaming, polishing, blasting and honing can be an artform. Too much can be overwhelming, whereas too little can appear out of place.

Not only can different finishes create truly spectacular designs, they can also provide valuable functional benefits for delineation and can act as a deterrent.




CASE STUDY

INTERNATIONAL QUARTER, LONDON

International Quarter London (IQL) is an exciting new space in Stratford dubbed as London's new destination for progressive business.

Gustafson Porter + Bowman's landscape design has created intrigue through the use of angular zones comprising of precision cut rhombus shaped sandstone, intersected with bands of granite and Stainless Steel strips.

The remarkable diamond shaped sandstone had to be meticulously cut to maintain the crisp linear flow of the space. In contrast to the sharp angles of the laying pattern, the outer edges used to create the planted areas were softer, utilising rounded contours for a unique finish.









CASE STUDY SOUSSE & BARDO MEMORIAL

The Sousse and Bardo Memorial, designed by George King Architects, is dedicated to the 31 British nationals who lost their lives in two terrorist attacks in Tunisia in 2015.

The memorial is inspired by the fluidity of geometry of flowing water frozen in place, and the landscaping continues this theme with a series of Callisto granite concentric circles that flow from the centre of the sculpture.

The understated elegance of the paving relied on the skill and experience of the Marshalls Design Team.

Graduating into the hillside, the radius design meant that each of the 200 granite blocks were unique and had to be sized specifically to form the flowing arch. As well as this the 70 different sizes of paving had to be individually designed to create the desired ripple effect.




CASE STUDY ICON SHOPPING CENTRE, O²

More than 200,000sq feet of prime space in southeast London had sat empty for over a decade when plans to install a supercasino fell through. But with 85 fashion and lifestyle stores spread over the outlet's two floors, retailers are finally making the most of this opportunity.

Marshalls supplied Vasanta Stonespar plank paving to the ground floor of the outlet. The sandstone is extremely robust and non-slip, so it's ideal for this location where there is a greater chance of wet foot traffic from the entrances.

The upper level was paved with bespoke limestone and marble supplied by Marshalls to perfectly complement the lower level's sandstone flooring, creating an understated, timeless beauty.

CASE STUDY

WARRINGTON TIME SQUARE

The beginning of a new chapter for Cheshire's largest town.

Warrington Council wanted to design a usable, vibrant outside space that enhanced the existing town centre.

The vision for Time Square was to bring together the leisure, retail and restaurants units while still allowing people to be able to enjoy the outside area. The space had to be functional, sociable and accessible to all with some sustainable planting features.

Marshalls provided the stone for all the hard landscaping and masonry units using a number of carefully selected granites. Bold blends of colour were selected to bring the landscape to life which adds to the vibrancy of the area.
